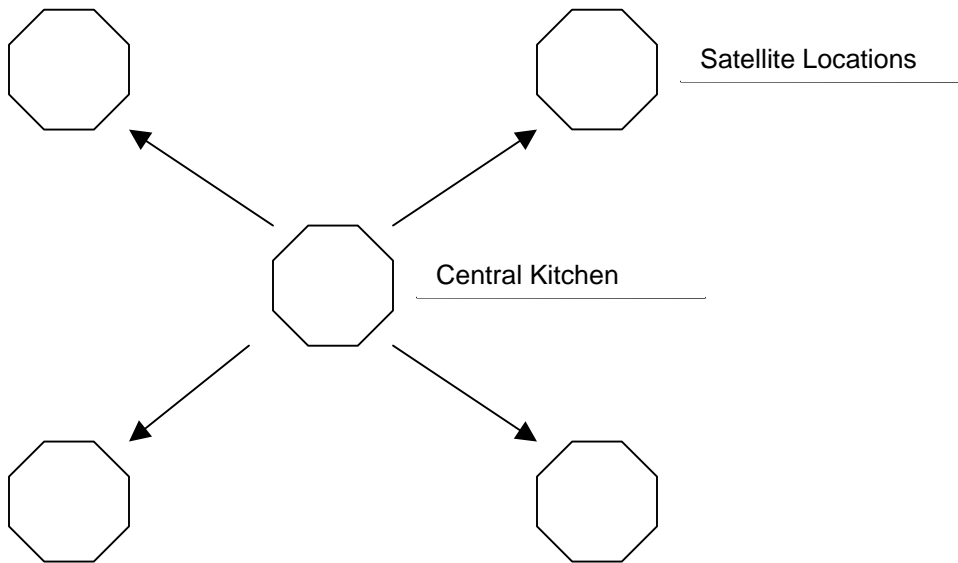


Background: On December 21 2004, Iraqi insurgents targeted a mess hall being used by U.S. forces in Mosul, Iraq. Many of those killed and injured were from the Stryker Brigade from Fort Lewis. Amtech Corporation, a manufacturer of fiberglass and composite armor for HMMWV's with corporate headquarters in Yelm, Washington, in a gesture of support for the soldiers from Fort Lewis, offered to donate to the Mealstar[®] HCF 90/90, one of their commercial food delivery vehicles. These vehicles allow for field delivery of hot and cold meals that have been centrally prepared and then distributed to outlying areas. Amtech's belief was that taking prepared meals to troops would reduce their vulnerability to attack by lowering the concentration of troops in one location, such as the mess hall.



Facts:

1. Offer initially made on 2/10/2005.
2. Army approval received 8/2006.
3. Amtech received support for this project from General Motors/Isuzu Commercial Truck Division, Ingersoll-Rand/Thermo King, and Mobile Fleet Services of Yakima.
4. The specific vehicle has been configured to meet requirements received from WO Luis Pineo.
5. Chassis will be from Isuzu and will carry two each 90 cubic foot boxes for both cold and frozen foods.
6. Chassis will be a heavy duty diesel NR1 and will include a preventive maintenance kit for vehicle service.
7. Vehicle will be painted CARC-Sand color as requested by WO Luis Pineo.
